Message from the President

The pandemic affected not only our community, but the Parent Resource Centre as an organization - impacting our services and how we delivered them so that we could keep supporting families in Ottawa. This past year continued to provide significant challenges, however, as we see the community returning to normal, we can see an even brighter future ahead.

As a Board, we focused on strengthening our organizational infrastructure allowing us to stay competitive post-COVID and expand our reach in the community. I want to highlight a few examples of the work that the Board committees accomplished this year: The Board & Policy Development Committee prepared new policies, including the Client Complaints Policy and a French Language Service Policy. In addition to providing financial oversight for the organization, financial planning, and the monitoring of internal controls and accountability policies, our Finance Committee worked meticulously this year to ensure PRC has the systems and supports in place as we come out of the pandemic, maintain our funding partnerships, and continue diversifying our funding. The Community Engagement Committee was established earlier in 2022, and the terms of reference were finalized. The committee will be looking at creative ways to strengthen PRC's current partnerships and source new partnership opportunities in the post-COVID landscape.

They have done an incredible job listening to families, adjusting programming and meeting people where they are at, to help with the devastating effects of isolation and poverty created by the pandemic. Their efforts have brought countless people out of isolation, instilled confidence in parents and caregivers, and added to the resilience of families. On behalf of the Board of Directors, I want to express my sincere gratitude



and appreciation to all PRC staff for the fantastic work that they do and commitment that they show to PRC daily.

I also want to extend our appreciation to the City of Ottawa, the Province of Ontario, specifically the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services, the Ottawa Community Foundation, and other partners of PRC for their support in enabling us to continue to serve our community. Message from the Executive Director

The PRC helps Parents, Caregivers and Early Childhood Educators because they help children and that is, and always has been, the end goal.

In spite of the pandemic continuing to loom over the city, this past fiscal year (April 2022 to March 2023), we noticed that families, who have been experiencing seclusion, were reaching out, feeling more confident and starting to get back out into the community. Parents whose children were born just prior to or during the pandemic started coming out and attending our EarlyON playgroups, allowing families to connect more with their community as their participation in these activities was limited for multiple years.


Funding

PRC was awarded new streams of funding as we demonstrated how timely and critical our services are.

Programs and Services

For over 47 years, PRC continues to function as a multi-purpose facility benefiting children, parents and front-line professionals. As the COVID-19 pandemic evolves and community needs continue to outpace our resources, we connect with families, collaborate more purposefully with community partners and work harder to improve the lives of high-risk children and families through direct service, advocacy, research and education.



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EARLYON PROGRAMS

Since our inception, PRC has served tens of thousands of children and families. With funds received from the City of Ottawa, we offer many popular programs and services, including (though not limited to):

EarlyON Playgroups (virtual, outdoors and indoors) Specialized Infant Programs Parent Workshops Parent Education Calendar Parent Support Line Toy Lending and Resource Libraries Parent Support Sessions



EarlyON programs had 2,794 visits by parents, and children virtually and in-person.

We have FUN !

We always have fun (*and learn lots*) when our playgroups get together, Last year, we hosted a Pizza & Potluck Lunch and a very yummy Pancake Day for families. We were also fortunate to have visits from Dental Hygienist Students from Algonquin College and the National Institute of Health to speak with parents/caregivers during our Playgoups. Stephanie our Dietician who works with the SandyHill Community Health Centre also visited. as well as Kathy from First Words.



Public Health Nurses came to visit to talk to parents about the Covid Vaccine and other Vaccinations. A Baby Massage Class (5 weeks) was held by Niuma, and Susan talked to parents about Safety in the Home for Baby.

We also had students from the BELCD Program at Algonquin College.









FAMILY RESILIENCE PROGRAM

Throughout 2022-2023 the Family Resilience Program (FRP) supported families tirelessly, (virtually, by phone and safely distanced) as part of our In-Home services.

This program provides client-centered, attachment-based, and trauma-informed parenting support services with minimal access barriers. FRP supports vulnerable high-risk families (parents, caregivers and children aged 0-18) who experience multiple barriers, challenges navigating services, and have not been able to access community parenting support. The FRP includes individualized services in clients' homes, group settings virtually or at the Parent Resource Centre.

PRC's FRP has four core objectives:



- Increase the **social functioning and parenting capacity** of the family; Support children's healthy development;
- Support the development of positive parenting skills; and
- Meet families where they are at and help them **navigate** other services when ready.

Our Family Resilience Program encourages parents/caregivers to build on their existing strengths and gain tools to use in everyday parenting. Parents learn to balance their own needs so they can meet the needs of the children in their care, and can increase their knowledge, skills and confidence.



COMMUNITY PARENT CUPBOARD (CPC)

Mission Accomplished!

For almost two years, PRC's CPC addressed unmet urgent needs and the reality of extraordinary expenses created by Covid-19 and isolation measures for vulnerable families in the Strathcona Heights / Sandy Hill community. On August 12th and September 9th, PRC held our last monthly distribution days for the CPC and hosted Open Houses where we informed families about the closure of the program. CPC families had the opportunity to have snacks & coffee and learn more about PRC programs and the staff who work at our centre. Niuma handed out the EarlyON activity schedule, and families were excited to learn more about what other options are available for parenting support in their neighbourhood. An infographic for families was created which included all the resources /programs /workshops that are available at PRC. At the last CPC Open House in September, the cupboard served 63 households (234 adults and children in total). Families were extremely grateful and thanked PRC for all the help.

The Cupboard was created to address immediate food insecurity. The CPC provided low income, vulnerable, racialized and newcomer families with essential items that are not regularly available through other support services. Most important were household cleaning supplies, personal care products, personal protective equipment, baby care and pantry staples (with culturally appropriate food items).

One of our CPC clients usually communicates via Google Translate with our coordinator Samantha, because he doesn't speak any English. During the last CPC, he brought a friend to translate, so he could thank her in a more personal way. It was such a rewarding feeling for Sam, and our client was so grateful for everything PRC has done for him and his family during such a difficult time.

EARLY YEARS' CAPACITY BUILDING

PRC's Community of Practice (CoP) sessions for Frontline Early Years' Professionals allow for sharing trauma informed practices, supporting equity and inclusion, and the provision

of up-to-date resources/strategies to support resilience, mental health and well-being. Participation in CoP sessions provided opportunities for reflection and peer support to improve engagement with families and increase positive health, mental health and developmental outcomes for children. Based on feedback from frontline professionals, the CoPs contributed to increased feelings of competence and efficacy in their role.

Supporting Mental Health and Resilience for Families & Frontline Early Learning Professionals

Throughout the year, our project, generously supported by Greenshield, impacted over **2,347** individuals, providing access to beneficial information via social networks, the opportunity to attend many different Community of Practice offerings and a variety of Mindfulness Practice Meditations and Relaxation journeys. **55**% of participants reported increased awareness of resources and tools. At least **50%** reported improved knowledge of resources and tools to support their well-being and better support families. **52%** indicated that they were able to make positive practice changes when workig with their families.

The topics for these sessions were generated as a response to emerging trends, challenges & demands impacting the workforce. In addition, we provided peer support & mentoring via email, a private Facebook group, evidence-based resource sharing & referrals. We are also actively involved in city-wide committees to support quality training initiatives, for the early years' workforce, affect positive system change, advance collective impact / community partnerships and advocate for vulnerable families in the community.





PRC Staff Development

Throughout the year, PRC Staff had several opportunities to get together to enhance their professional development in order to work on our collective resilience, and explore topics that impact our work and would provide a foundation for further exploration and discussion. From Mindfulness Practice to "Exploring a Healthy Workplace, to Psychological Safety in the Workplace, Team PRC pushed familiar boundaries to explore beyond our comfort zone

Bidz4Kidz Online Auction

Our fourth annual Bidz4Kidz online silent auction was held from November 25 to December 12, 2022. We secured 99 items and raised \$2,987.25 (our goal was \$2,000)! We had a significant amount of traffic to the site (thousands of pageviews) and 458 bids.

The **PRC Family Resilience Program Team** in collaboration with **Ottawa Collaborative for Parenting Support Task Group** (OCPS) launched the new Just Ask Poster on November 28, 2022. PRC partnered with, **211**, **Parenting in Ottawa** and **1call I click** for this initiative.





On August 26, 2022, the Parent Resource Centre participated in the first annual **Strathcona Heights Community Fun Day** from 1pm to 9pm, held at Dutchies Hole community park. This event engaged children of all ages in an outdoor environment to play sports, explore the area, and enjoy some other well-planned activities. PRC ran a variety of programming for the younger age groups (0 to 6 years old) with an obstacle course, bubbles, parachute, music station and art. Other organizations, such as **Christie Lake Kids**, **Boys and Girls Club, Ottawa Community Housing** and **Prezidential Basketball** were also in attendance.

Power of Play 2022

After having to postpone our event due to the pandemic, PRC was finally able to get back out into the community and hold our annual outdoor Power of Play event in Strathcona Park, Sandy Hill. We hosted over 160 families from all over the Ottawa area!

The Power of Play ran from 9:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and families enjoyed many unique activities such as a StoryWalk® with a themed play area, farm hopper races, sporting activities, giant balls, balance beams, art, music, board games, yummy snacks, and much more.









