

EARLYON PROGRAMS

As one of Ontario's EarlyON Child and Family Centres, the Parent Resource Centre is pleased to offer a diverse range of playgroups and services for young children of all ages, at all stages of early development.

We provide a welcoming space where parents, caregivers, and children can participate in fun activities, connect with other families, learn about the different services in the community, and get advice from early childhood development professionals. Some of our more popular programs included our Indigenous Family Circle, More 2 Love Twin group, Baby Signs and Music and Movement.

In the first few months of 2019–2020 FY, PRC had **3 satellite locations as well as our main site at** at 300 Goulburn Crescent. We served over **7587** parents, caregivers and children in our drop-in, baby groups and activities combined.

Our popular toy library, **kept over 500 children** busy this past year by allowing parents and caregivers to borrow toys to meet the developmental and entertainment needs of their little ones.



FAMILY RESILIENCE PROGRAM


Our Family Resilience Program (FRP) provides client-centered, trauma-informed parenting support services . Our Program is a support service for vulnerable high-risk families (parents and children aged 0-18) who are not connected to or able to

access community parenting services. The FRP includes individualized services in our clients' homes, or in a group setting at the Parent Resource Centre.

Our Family Resilience Program allows parents to build on their existing strengths and gain tools to use in everyday parenting. Parents learn to balance their own needs so that they can meet the needs of the children in their care, and can increase their knowledge, skills and confidence in raising children, including those with challenging behaviours, developmental delays, and/or mental health diagnoses. Families receive short-term interventions based on their capacities and strengths.

Last year, the FRP Program made **905 visits to parents and caregivers and 517 children**. Additionally, we served **397 professionals** and made **139 referrals** to outside resources to further support our families. **120 parents/caregivers and 50 children** were served through our in-home program.

2019-2020 saw **79 new families** referred to us from outside sources. In years past, approximately **75% of our referrals** came from the Children's Aid Society - this year, there was a **7% increase in referrals** from other sources, and an **overall increase of 56% in referrals in to the program**.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We help parents, caregivers and professionals – because they help children.

At the Parent Resource Centre, we provide an inclusive, holistic space for play, learning and support. Our services are accessible to all parents throughout Ottawa, and in addition to our playgroups and parent workshops, we engage and support parents in a variety of ways including our **Parent Support Line**, **Parent Education Calendar**, and **GoFamily! Map**.

PRC is regularly out in the community to support families, share our resources and build partnerships within the Early Years' sector and Ottawa business communities.

One of our favorite events to attend is the **Parent and Child Expo** (photo above) which is fun for the whole family and helps to promote our largest event, **Power of Play** which takes place in the summer.

In addition to social media, we engage our on-line community with our holiday **toy drive** and annual **Bidz4kidz** fundraising event, supported by many local businesses and individual donors.

We are also a volunteer friendly organization, working with corporate volunteer groups (painting, play structure assembly and baking), individual volunteers (reading & baking) and students to enhance our programs.



PROFESSIONAL AND PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

Professional and Personal Development offerings at PRC are delivered in the form of Coffee Chats, Workshops, and Communities of Practice for parents, caregivers and early learning professionals. Best practices in early learning and care, as well as strategies to enhance your professional practice and parenting skills are offered.

In 2019-2020, **553 professionals** and **596 parents/caregivers** attended our sessions.

Topics included such things as Risky Play, Service Quality, Serve and Return strategy, Effective Communications, Temperament, Self-Regulation in Children, and Time-In strategies.

Since 1975, as a charitable, social service organization, the Parent Resource Centre (PRC) continues to remain focused on child development and supporting parents/caregivers by promoting best practices for parenting and building resilient families. 
